We started 2012 with a special guest the celebrated actress Vinie Burrows who helped us honor the memory of Martin Luther King at a screening of an episode of EYES ON THE PRIZE". Next we broke our all time attendance record with a screening of VANISHING CITY, a film by two local filmmakers Jen Senko and Fiore DiRosa. The film reveals the policy of favoring wealthy corporate developers that seek to transform New York City into a playland for the internationally wealthy to the economic detriment of local neighborhoods with their rich tapestry of cultural life and traditions.

In March we honored 95 year old Marie Runyon, a legend in NYC activist circles for the past 60 years. In August we screened a film celebrating the life of Indian activist Vandana Shiva. In September we honored the late great Nobel Peace Prize laureate, Kenyon environmental activist Wangari Maathai. A SKYPE interview with the film's director added to our list of special guest filmmakers who attended our screenings this year.

With HOT COFFEE we showed how there is much more behind the campaign against "frivolous lawsuits" than meets the eye. Exposing political manipulation by the super wealthy in KOCH BROTHERS EXPOSED was also quite gratifying. PRECIOUS KNOWLEDGE took a long look inside the struggle for ethnic studies in the Arizona public school system. Films on mountaintop removal, the global fresh water supply, and nuclear power showed the multi faceted face of the environmental question.

In February Resistance Cinema was proud to collaborate with Action For Justice and the Anti Racist Team in a day long program called a Symposium on Race featuring the award winning 3 part documentary series "RACE: THE POWER OF AN ILLUSION". It was a resounding success which interspersed film, speakers, and an interactive facilitated workshop.

Once again our year end holiday party featured a hilarious film, "Dr. Strangelove", followed by an abundant feast.
